



OUR SENATORS WANT TO HEAR WHAT YOU THINK

Dear Care1st and ONECare Providers, Office Staff & Billing Staff:

The Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) has compiled an analysis of the American Health Care Act (as passed by the U.S. House of Representatives) and the Better Care Reconciliation Act (BCRA) (as released by the U.S. Senate on June 22, 2017). This analysis is based on a preliminary review of the BCRA as is subject to revision.

High-Level BCRA Overview FY 2018-FY 2026

Impacts	
Federal Match Change (includes early-expansion penalty)	\$2.9 billion
Hospital Assessment Replacement (2022-2026)	\$2.0 billion
Potential Per Capita Cap Inflation Impacts (2020-2026)	\$2.2 billion
Potential Total State Impacts	\$7.1 billion

The Congressional Budget Office estimated this week the Senate bill (BCRA) will increase the number of people who are uninsured by 22 million by 2026 relative to the number under current law. This is just 1 million fewer than the increase in the number of uninsured estimated for the House-passed legislation. By 2026, an estimated 49 million people will be uninsured if BCRA passes.

Our Republican Senators have an important decision ahead of them and they've both indicated they want to hear what health care providers think about the Better Care Reconciliation Act (the Senate version of Repeal & Replace).
